

All Classical Portland Launches 1st-of-its-Kind Challenge to Change America's Playlist

Recording Inclusivity Initiative Tackles the Representation Gap of Classical Composers Underrepresented on Today's Classical Music Airwaves

PORTLAND, Ore. January 13, 2021 – All Classical Portland announced today the launch of its "Recording Inclusivity Initiative: Changing America's Playlist" Challenge, in collaboration with the N M Bodecker Foundation and leading classical music record label

Naxos Records. With core funding support from the Oregon Cultural Trust, the Recording Inclusivity Initiative (RII) will produce and release five new high-quality and broadcast-ready recordings of works by classical composers from underrepresented communities within its inaugural year. As part of the launch, All Classical Portland is also challenging listeners and the arts community to nominate composers.

Nominations will be accepted January 13 through February 12, 2021 at allclassical.org/recordinginclusivity.

The Recording Inclusivity Initiative (RII) seeks to address the scarcity of high-quality recordings of classical music written by composers from communities that are underrepresented in the concert hall and on the classical music airwaves. This industry-wide gap is the result of pervasive inequities in

classical music. While data is limited, examples cited in a 2016 study conducted by the League of American Orchestras show:

- 1. Fewer than 3% of musicians in American orchestras are African American
- 2. Fewer than 4% of musicians in American orchestras are Hispanic
- 3. Only 1 out of 10 musical directors in American orchestras are women

"As an industry, we have a responsibility to create the change that we seek for greater inclusivity and access. We are in a unique position to drive that change as an independent, community-minded radio station with international reach across multiple platforms," said Suzanne Nance, All Classical Portland's President & CEO. "The Recording Inclusivity Initiative is another step towards fulfilling our mission to build and sustain culturally vibrant communities around the arts. I'm extremely grateful to the RII panelists and our collaborators for helping to lead this effort to promote industry-wide change."

Tanya Cerda, Trustee of the N M Bodecker Foundation added: "The Recording Inclusivity Initiative is an important project that's very much aligned with the N M Bodecker Foundation's core values of creativity, belonging, and collaboration. We're honored to provide recording studio time and production support to the winning composers. We look forward to working with All Classical Portland, and with the participating artists, to celebrate and elevate representation in classical music."

The RII selection panel is chaired by AII Classical Portland's 2020-2021 Artist in Residence Adam Eccleston. The panel will select five compositions (each up to 30 minutes in length) to be performed by professional musicians at the N M Bodecker Foundation in recording sessions overseen by Creative Director Chris Funk (member of the indie rock band The Decemberists). The recording process will begin as early as April 2021, and the recordings will be released and distributed by Naxos Records starting in the Fall of 2021. Of the challenge awardees, two contemporary composers will be offered a week-long Composer-in-Residency that will include in-studio creative recording sessions and a \$2,500 award.

This panel also includes musicians from the regional arts community and national industry leaders. The recordings created through RII will be added to the station's regular playlists, reaching 250,000 weekly listeners across the Pacific Northwest and millions worldwide, and digitally distributed worldwide by the record label Naxos Records.

These new recordings will be made available to radio stations across the country along with All Classical Portland's "how-to" kit for stations to create their own regional recording initiative.
