All Classical Portland Preps the Halls for the Holidays, With Star-Studded Soundtrack for the Season

From Karaoke Carols to Cinnamon Bear on ICAN, the station's holiday programming has something for everyone.

PORTLAND, Oregon - <u>All Classical Portland</u>, the Pacific Northwest's premiere 24-hour classical music radio station, is offering star-studded, community-centered holiday programming to bring 2021 to a close and ring in the New Year on a high note. The station and its second channel for children and families, the <u>International Children's Arts Network</u> (ICAN), offers a joyful and heartwarming soundtrack to the season for listeners of all ages across Oregon, SW Washington, and beyond—with festive programming, classic carols, musical theater-inspired renditions of holiday favorites, gourmet recipes from celebrity chefs **Alton Brown** and **Lidia Bastianich**, and much more. Listeners can tune in to All Classical Portland at 89.9 FM in Portland, or anywhere in the world at <u>allclassical.org/holiday-2021</u>, with 24-hour programming for children streaming worldwide on ICAN at <u>icanradio.org</u>.

The festivities commence with the station's ever popular *Gratitude Program* on Thanksgiving Day, Thursday, November 25, 2021. From November 1st – 14th, listeners are invited to call 503-802-9474 to leave a voice message, sharing what they are most thankful for. Hosted by **Suzanne Nance and produced by Andrea Murray**, the hour-long program features uplifting music woven together with listener messages, creating a uniquely touching experience. The *Gratitude Program* will air on Thanksgiving at 11:00 AM PT, with an encore broadcast at 5:00 PM PT.

In November, *Sunday Brunch* is bringing more than just a soundtrack to the table. Just in time for the holidays, host Suzanne Nance will serve up gourmet recipes from star chefs including **Alton Brown** and **Lidia Bastianich** each week, alongside recipes from local celebrity chefs and marvelous music from around the world. This popular program shines a light on culinary artisans as the restaurant industry rebuilds and reopens. Recipes from restaurants and guest chefs are made available at <u>allclassical.org</u> and the station's social channels for listeners to revisit and add to their own holiday menus.

From **December 1**st – **January 7**th, the International Children's Arts Network (ICAN) will air the classic holiday show about the adventures of *Cinnamon Bear*, daily at 12:00 PM and 6:00 PM PT on <u>icanradio.org</u>. First aired in Portland on November 25, 1937, the six week-long series tells the tale of Paddy O'Cinnamon (The Cinnamon Bear), as he prepares and counts down to Christmas. Narrated by Bud Hiestand, the series features songs composed by Don Honrath and conducted by Felix Mills, with lyrics by Glanville Heisch. Vocals were provided by the Paul Taylor Quartet. The program furthers

ICAN's mission of educating and entertaining young minds, and providing families with enjoyable, age-appropriate radio content.

"ICAN amplifies children's powerful voices and stories, serving as a treasured resource that encourages arts engagement, comprehensive at-home learning, and child-friendly activities," Sarah Zwinklis, ICAN manager, host, and producer, said. "Studies show that brain development during a child's first five years is faster than at any other time in life. ICAN is proud to share commercial-free music and art programming to enrich these important, formative years."

On **Sunday, December 19**th, All Classical Portland will put a new spin on holiday classics by showcasing local theater companies and performers. *A Very Theatrical Holiday* will air at **12:00 PM PT** and feature performances by Lakewood Theatre Company, Broadway Rose, Portland Playhouse, and many more! The program will re-air on Tuesday, December 21st at 7:00 PM PT.

Families can keep the party going on demand with All Classical Portland's *Karaoke Carols*, available all winter long at <u>allclassical.org/holiday-2021</u>. With karaoke-style piano accompaniment and easy to follow lyrics, listeners can gather their loved ones together around the music, and create their very own singalong at home.

From **December 22**nd – **25**th, the station will offer its annual *Festival of Carols*, four days of cherished seasonal music from diverse cultures around the world. Listeners can expect beloved Christmastime classics, including excerpts from Tchaikovsky's *The Nutcracker* and Handel's *Messiah*, alongside new releases, and all-time favorite carols. *Festival of Carols* includes a live broadcast of *A Festival of Nine Lessons and Carols* from King's College, Cambridge, on December 24th at 7:00 AM PT.

All Classical Portland will close out the year in style with its annual *Classical Countdown*, beginning at **7:00 AM PT** on New Year's Eve, **Friday**, **December 31**st, right up to midnight! Listeners can vote for their favorite classical pieces, doing their part to craft a celebratory soundtrack for New Year's Eve. The *Classical Countdown* poll will be open December 1st through December 15th at <u>allclassical.org/holiday-2021</u>, and the top 100 pieces will be revealed throughout the day on the 31st.

Connecting communities through music locally and globally, All Classical Portland will kick off 2022 with a live morning broadcast of the **Vienna Philharmonic New Year's Concert on January 1, 2022.** The acclaimed orchestra will share lively and nostalgic music to usher in the New Year.

All Classical Portland President & CEO **Suzanne Nance** said: "This radio station is a gathering place for listeners locally and around the world, where we can revel in the music that brings a little magic to our lives—every day, and especially during the holidays.
