Beyond word of mouth, general press coverage, or standard marketing and promotion, the stations of All Classical Portland address issues of cultural vitality, arts community viability, the significance of music as it relates to the human experience, health and education by dedicating significant airtime to conversations and performance to these community initiatives. These unique opportunities serve to enlighten a diverse audience within a broad region while deepening relationships with community partner organizations.

Special programming dealing with local issues include the following programs:

<u>CLUB MOD</u> A weekly exploration dedicated to future classics and music by living composers with host Andrea Murray.

<u>ICAN AUDIO BOOK TOUR</u> A monthly radio/streaming program highlighting contemporary children's books to help improve literacy, share diverse stories, and teach children to navigate the world with authenticity, kindness, and integrity. Featured on All Classical Portland's second channel, ICAN (on HD-2 and streaming online), Audio Book Tour addresses the heightened community need for cost-free educational programming.

NORTHWEST PREVIEWS All Classical Portland's celebration of the local arts scene. A five-minute program highlighting arts events for the upcoming weekend and week ahead.

ON DECK WITH YOUNG MUSICIANS A weekly interview with young classical performers from Oregon and Southwest Washington.

<u>THURSDAYS @ THREE</u> Each week, All Classical Portland presents live performances showcasing local and visiting musicians, broadcast from our studios. Christa Wessel hosts the live show, and interviews the musicians on topics related to their art.

Amy Faust gets to know Maya, a senior at Cleveland High school who plays flute and piccolo for various school ensembles as well as the Metropolitan Youth Symphony. Maya started playing the piano at age 5, but as a member of the Cherokee Nation she was drawn early on to the native flute playing at the tribal gatherings her family would attend each summer. Her passion for classical music is matched by her drive to bring attention to indigenous history and justice. At Cleveland, she co-founded a native student union and is part of the campaign to change the school's name due to Grover Cleveland's anti-indigenous policies. For this segment, Maya plays a contemporary piece (Homeland, by Allison Loggins-Hull) that evokes her people's history of displacement.

Club Mod

An hour of music, with commentary, about music on Black history by Black composers. Included were selections from Requiem for the Enslaved, by Carlos Simon - which tells the stories of the enslaved people bought and sold by the founders of Georgetown University.

Interviews with all 3 of the contemporary composers featured on "Amplify, Vol. 1" - the first release from All Classical Portland's *Recording Inclusivity Initiative*. Part of the station's DEI effort, the initiative records works by composers from historically marginalized communities, making them heard on America's classical radio stations.
