Portland, OR — [July 30, 2025] — All Classical Radio today announced that Greg Arntson, a respected civic leader and seasoned executive, has been named the Media Network's Interim Chief Executive Officer beginning September 1, 2025. The appointment comes as current President & CEO Suzanne Nance moves into the role of Transition Manager, ahead of her previously announced departure later this year.

"Greg is an exceptional leader who understands both the heart and the mechanics of this organization," said All Classical Radio's Board Chair Elaine Durst. "His integrity, strategic insight, and dedication to service make him the ideal person to lead All Classical through this important moment of transition."

A dedicated supporter of the arts, Arntson has a sophisticated understanding of All Classical Radio and its mission, and has been a highly engaged member of the All Classical Radio Board of Directors since 2024. He brings a spirit of stewardship rooted in decades of service, having held several prominent roles in the community, including:



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- Two-time President of the Board, Portland Hollywood Lions Club, where he
  facilitated food drives, shepherded eyeglass and hearing aid programs, and forged
  partnerships with local institutions like Guide Dogs for the Blind
- Board member, the Royal Rosarians, Portland's official greeters and ambassadors

Arntson brings a wealth of expertise in business strategy, operations, and governance. In addition to his civic and professional contributions, Arntson served for 10 years on the International Board of Directors of the Asphalt Emulsion Manufacturers Association (AEMA), where he provided leadership on infrastructure policy, advocacy, and innovation in sustainability. He currently serves as Executive Vice President of Albina Asphalt and previously led Albina Fuel as President and CEO for 14 years. In the 1980's, he was stationed in Germany as an US Army Specialist.

"All Classical Radio has shown that building community through music and storytelling can have a global positive impact," says Arntson. "I am honored to serve as All Classical Radio's Interim CEO. I look forward to working with the Board of Directors and the leadership team to ensure this Media Network enters its next chapter with strength, stability, and a continued dedication to excellence," he adds.

As Transition Manager, Suzanne Nance will collaborate closely with Arntson and the Board through the fall to ensure a smooth leadership handoff. Together, they will support the national CEO search, advance strategic priorities, and deepen engagement with stakeholders across the region and beyond.
